What are Students' Union elections?

Students' Union elections are your chance to choose who will represent you.

The elected students become either student officers or school representatives, and will act as your voice in the University. They can drive real change to help improve your university experience, so it's vital that you have your say on who wins.

Why your vote matters

Education is one of the biggest investments you will make in your future, and it isn't cheap. Voting means you get to choose who is working on your behalf, so that you get the best out of your student experience.

Voting is one of the best ways to make your voice heard by the University. The people you choose have the power to create change. By voting you can decide what changes matter to you.

Our student leaders have a noticeable impact on your life at uni, from academic matters to your social life and wellbeing. With that in mind, it's a no-brainer to spend a little time having your say on who should hold that power.

How does voting work?

We use the single transferable vote (STV) system. This produces more representative results than other systems. The system's name says a lot about how it works. You have one vote, which can be transferred to lower-preference candidates if needed. This means no vote is ever wasted. If your first choice candidate doesn't win, your second or third could instead. All the student officers will be elected in a single election. The specific roles will be allocated after the successful candidates are confirmed.

How to vote

- **1.** Rank candidates in order of preference. Number your favourite candidate 1, second favourite 2, and so on.
- 2. You can rank as many candidates as you like, but we encourage you to rank as many as possible at least five in the student officer election.
- 3. If you don't like any of the candidates, you can vote to re-open nominations. In the case that this is the most popular option, no-one will be elected, and a new election will take place.
- **4.** The system will take care of the rest, transferring your vote where needed. This means you will have a say even if your top choice doesn't win.

Candidate conduct

It is vital that all our candidates follow the rules during the elections. If you think a candidate has broken the rules, report it to us at su.elections@uel.ac.uk so that we can investigate their behaviour.

It is against the rules for someone to pressure you to vote for a candidate, to try to make you log in to vote, or to try to make you use their device to vote. You are entitled to vote in private, and your choices will be kept confidential.

Best practice for voters:

- Get informed take the time to read the candidates' statements before you log in to vote.
- Consider the candidates on merit and vote for the candidates you think will be great student representatives.

Why should students vote for you?


